TRANSITION TO KINDERGARTEN

The Sequim School District is considering adding a Transition to Kindergarten Program (TK).

This **FREE**, full day, early learning program will focus on essential academics, social-emotional skills, and learning habits to empower children as they launch into their academic journey.

Children may be eligible for Transitional Kindergarten if they meet the following criteria:

1. Child is age 4 by August 31, 2023 and
2. Child has had limited or no experience in a formal preschool, daycare or other learning environment and
3. Families that are not eligible for early learning programs such as Head Start or Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program
