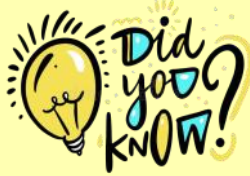

Pretzels

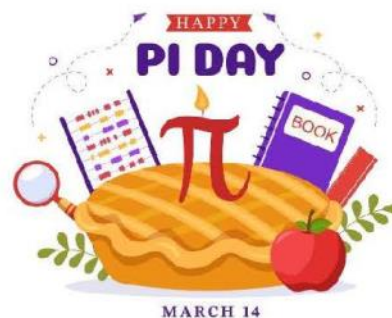

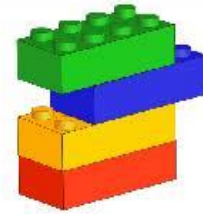

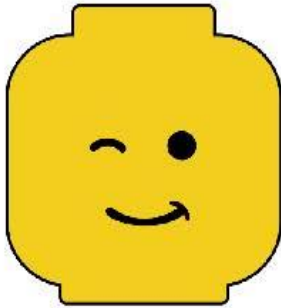
